Bars are Kosher *Pareve* Certified in Switzerland by Rabbi Abraham Hochwald, Chief Rabbi of the Northern Rhine-Germany and have not *kitniyot* in them. The CJLS has determined that such items may be used on Passover if purchased before *bedikat hametz*.

These organic chocolate bars are crafted using only the purest ingredients, grown with care by small farmer co-ops. The products offered through this fundraiser (on this website) are soy lecithin-free, meaning that they do not contain any soy products (*kitniyot*), which are prohibited on Passover for Ashkenazi Jews. Rabbi Aaron Alexander has approved them as Kosher for Passover if acquired before *bedikat chametz* (the night before first seder).

The chocolate is listed in the Conservative movement's Passover guide.
